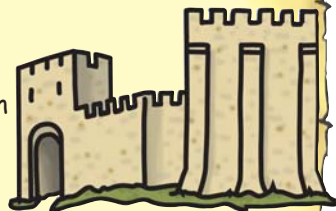

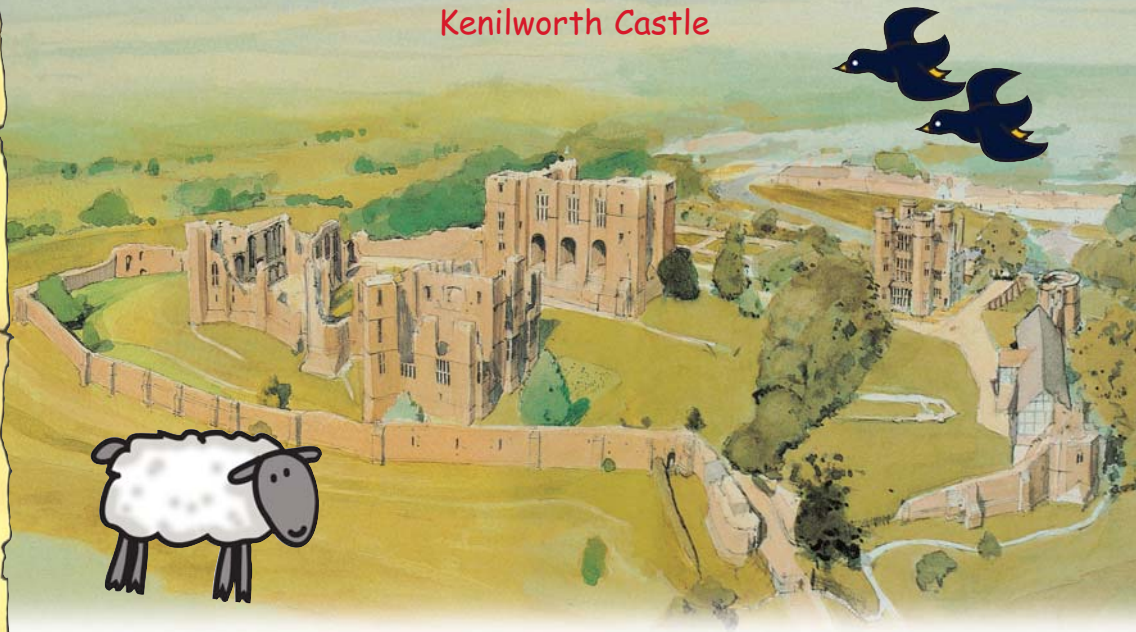

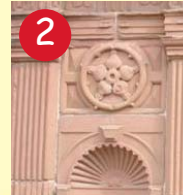
Robert Dudley decorated the castle to impress his royal visitor Elizabeth I.

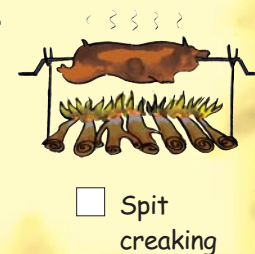

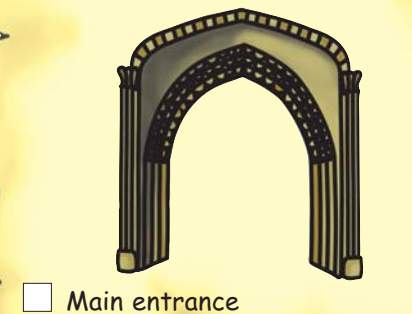
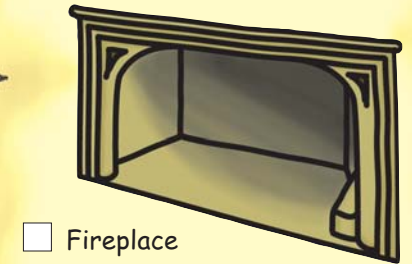


 Preparations for a banquet have created a lot of noise in the castle kitchens. What sounds can the serving boy hear?



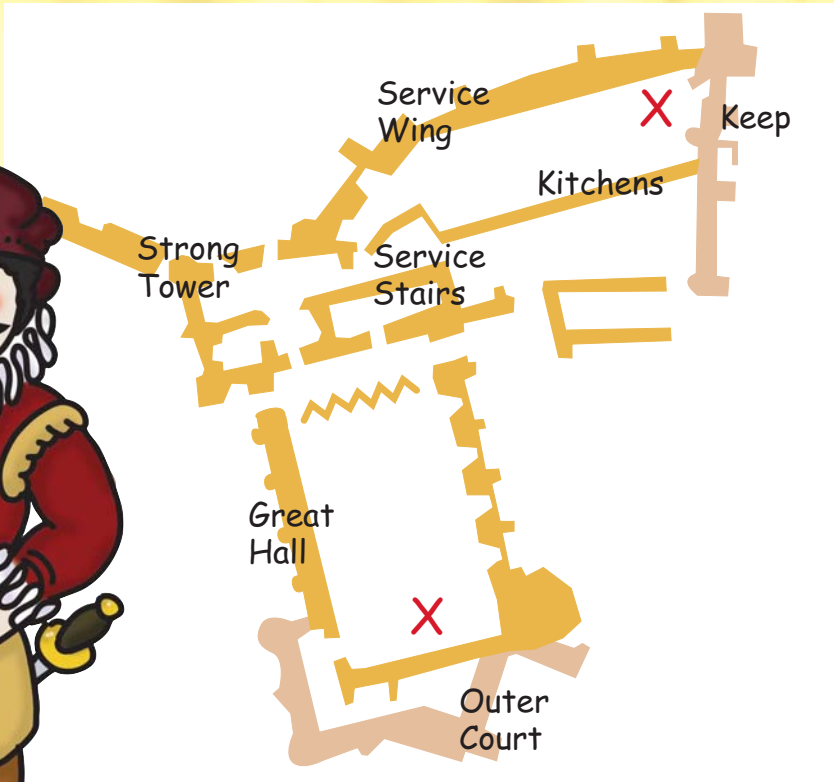
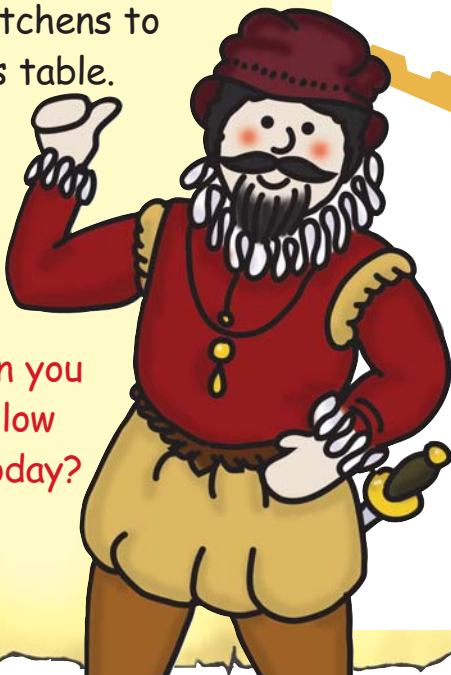
The great hall was used for feasting and meetings. The floor was made of wood and has rotted away but there are clues to tell you where it used to be.
