ACCESS INFORMATION

There is wheelchair access to some of the buildings and grounds including the shop and café, plus lift access to the fortress Falmouth and the First World War exhibition on the first floor of the Royal Artillery Barracks. Paths to this building are level, hard surfaces. There are steep steps inside the Tudor Gun Tower and descending tunnels with rough surfaces leading to Half-Moon Battery.
