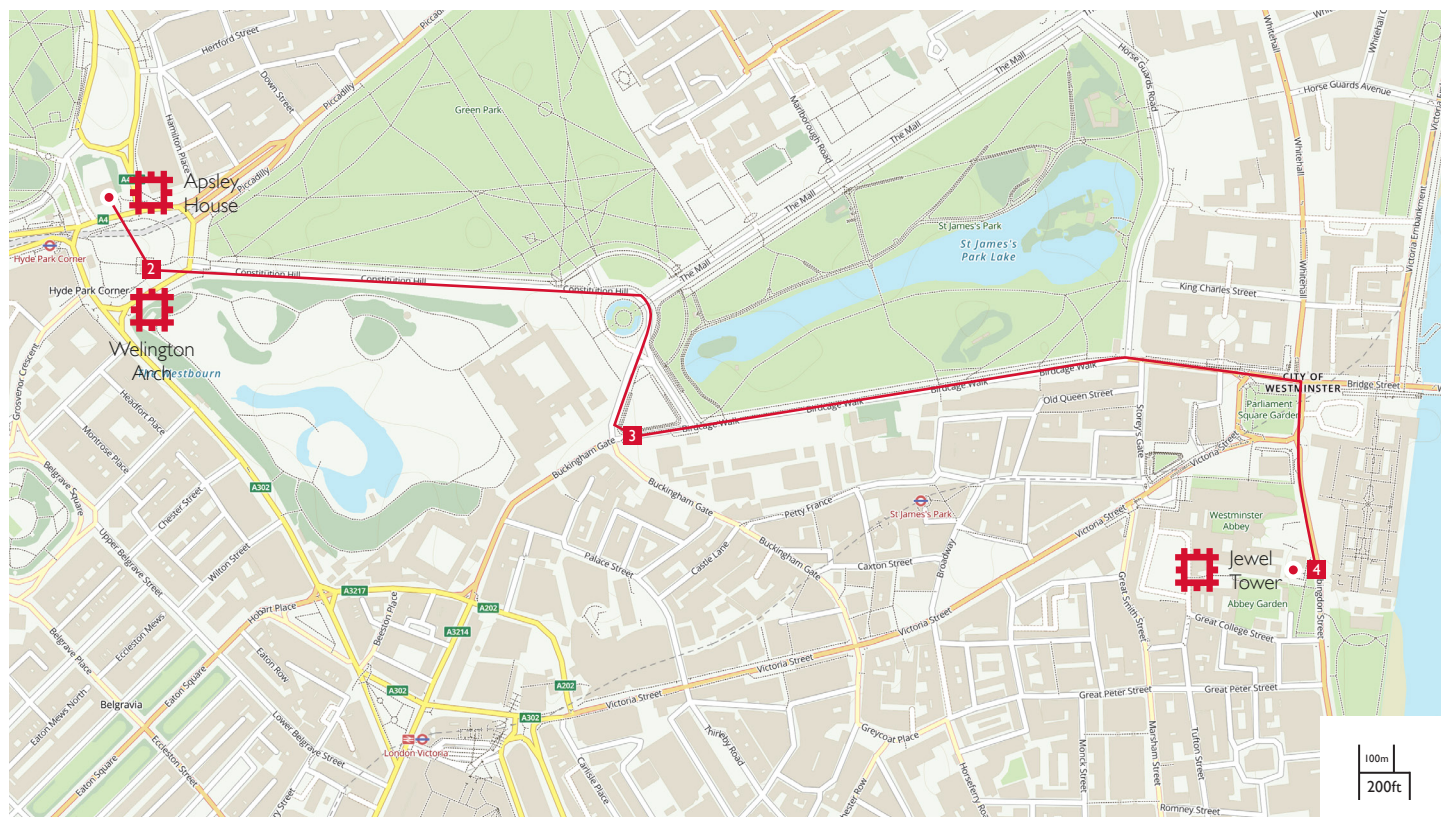


# Apsley House, Wellington Arch and Jewel Tower London

## Need to know

- **OS reference:** OS Explorer map 173
- **Distance:** 3 miles/4.8km circular (two hours, visiting the landmarks)
- **Difficulty:** 1/5
- **Terrain:** An easy walk through an urban environment around central London landmarks
- **Access:** This walk is suitable for pushchairs or wheelchairs but there is limited access at the properties.
- **Dog walkers:** Dogs are not permitted at the properties
- **Refreshments:** Drinks and snacks are available to buy at the coffee shop at The Jewel Tour, plus there is a picnic area with views of the Houses of Parliament and Westminster Abbey
- **Sat nav:** Starts Apsley House, 149 Piccadilly, W1J 7NT (020 7499 5676); ends Jewel Tower, Abingdon Street, SW1P 3JX
- **Grid reference:** Apsley House (TQ 28382 79901) via Wellington Arch to The Jewel Tower (TQ 30155 79385), London

## Directions

- 1 The trail starts outside Apsley House, sitting adjacent to Hyde Park Corner tube station, located on the fringe of Hyde Park. Head left along Hyde Park Corner and cross Piccadilly.
- 2 The approach to Wellington Arch lies just beyond, with Green Park behind you.
- 3 After visiting Wellington Arch, turn left and, skirting the perimeter of Buckingham Palace, head east along Birdcage Walk to Westminster tube station.
- 4 From here, drop down Abingdon Street to the Jewel Tower, the final visit of these three historic sites.
