NEW MEMBERS OF THE TEAM

We're thrilled to have recruited Marble Hill's new Head Gardener, who will work with volunteers to revive the park's gardens and landscape. If you'd like to volunteer, opportunities will be advertised on english-heritage.org.uk/support-us/volunteer/ when they become available.

We have also recruited a new Apprentice Gardener. Training is an important part of the project at Marble Hill. Apprentices get the chance to develop their skills across a range of roles, and they'll also receive professional qualifications to help further their careers. In future years we'll be recruiting a Catering Apprentice, a Play Worker Apprentice and a Heritage Apprentice, and we'll advertise these roles on our website and on our social media channels.

A SUCCESSFUL SUMMER

We had an action-packed summer at Marble Hill. Over 4,000 people joined us for activities and events including tours of the landscape, art picnics, a family fun day, heritage mornings, an outdoor cinema, afternoon tea and workshops about herbs and nettles. Some very brave souls even got up at 5am to take part in a dawn chorus walk through the park.

WHAT IS MARBLE HILL REVIVED?

Marble Hill is a much-loved space for both locals and Londoners, young and old, to relax and play. However, since the 1980s it's seen little investment.

Opening times for the historic house are limited and much of the park's original character has been lost. Right across Marble Hill, the facilities need upgrading.

A £4.08m grant from the Heritage Lottery Fund and Big Lottery presents a unique chance to revive Marble Hill, to bring its stories to life, to involve more local people in it, and to invest in its long term future.

Marble Hill Revived is about keeping what makes Marble Hill so special, but also making it better.

WORKING WITH OUR PARTNERS

The Rangers have been working with volunteers from the Environment Trust to plant a new line of hedging along the western edge of the park. The hedge has been designed to help wildlife thrive – it will provide more nectar, berries and foliage and increase the amount of habitats and biodiversity in the park. It took 83 people 539 hours to clear the area, lay a protective fence and plant the hedge. Thank you for everyone who volunteered.
