6 Some burials were exhumed and reburied in the small cemetery in 1913. Only a few Headstones remain, although all burials have long been exhumed.

7 Dedicated to Our Lady of the Assumption, the Chapel can be viewed from the exterior at any reasonable time.

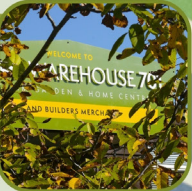

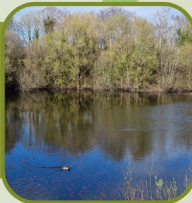

7 Rotherwas Chapel



Rotherwas Chapel was the private chapel of the Bodenham family. It stood in extensive parkland of Rotherwas House, which was demolished in 1926. There may have been a medieval chapel on the site, but the present building was started by Sir Roger Bodenham in 1583. Following a miraculous cure at St Winifrid's Holy well at Holywell in 1606, Sir Roger made the chapel a place of Roman Catholic worship. The tower dates from the 18th century, and the chancel from the 19th century.
