# Before Your Visit – Booking Tickets

I can look at the English Heritage website:

I can book tickets here, or I can buy them  
when I arrive at the museum.



# At Wroxeter Roman City – Parking

I can park my car in the car park and walk to the museum.

I could also arrive by bus, train, bicycle, or coach.

# At Wroxeter Roman City – Staff & Volunteers

If I need help or assistance during my visit, I can approach a member of staff or a volunteer who will be more than happy to assist me with anything I might need.

To identify a member of the team, I can look out for khaki coloured clothing, or an English Heritage name badge which will tell me the person's name.



# At Wroxeter Roman City – Tickets



If I am not an English Heritage member I can buy a ticket at the ticket desk, if I have not bought one in advance. There will always be somebody there to assist me.

I can pay by either cash or card. I might have to wait in a queue.

The ticket desk has an induction loop.



# At Wroxeter Roman City – Accessibility



Wroxeter Roman City offer a wide range of Access resources that I can borrow if I need to. These include:

- Large print guide
- Grade I Braille guide
- Audio described audio guide
- BSL guide

There is also a power assisted wheelchair for loan and sensory borrow bags which include ear defenders, fidget toys and communication cards.

If I want to use any of these during my visit, I will just ask a member of staff who will be more than happy to assist.

# At Wroxeter Roman City – Gift Shop

The museum gift shop is next to the ticket desk.

In the shop I will find a selection of English Heritage gifts and themed souvenirs.

If I want to buy anything from the gift shop, I will use the same desk where I bought my tickets.

I can pay with either cash or card in the gift shop.



# At Wroxeter Roman City – Museum

Directly from the gift shop area, I will enter the museum exhibition. In here I will find never before seen personal items that shine a light on the lives of Roman people.

This area is generally dark and can become quite noisy during busier periods.

There are toilets outside that I can use. There will be signs to show me the way.




# At Wroxeter Roman City – Food & Drink

There are a lot of opportunities to sit down when exploring the outside exhibits if I need a rest.

During my time outside at Wroxeter Roman City, I may find some steps, but I can choose not to use these if I don't want to.



# At Wroxeter Roman City – Forum and Town House

When I am ready to explore the replica Roman town house, I must cross a road through this gate. It is important that I am aware of my surroundings and beware of any oncoming traffic before I cross.



# At Wroxeter Roman City – Town House

The Roman town house was built in the early 2000's for a TV program shown on Channel 4. The program followed six modern day builders as they attempted to build the replica townhouse using only Roman traditional building methods and tools.

The town house is now open to the public, which means I can explore it during my visit to Wroxeter.



# At Wroxeter Roman City – Forum

These are the sunken remains of columns from the front of the forum, an important public Roman building. There is a steep drop so it's important to be careful not to trip or get close to the edge.



# At Wroxeter Roman City – own House

Some parts of the town house are closed off to the public. It is important that I stay behind the gates when looking in these areas.



# At Wroxeter Roman City – Town House

There are some areas of the town house that can be dark, so I must be careful when exploring these areas.

The Roman replica town house also has a sensory garden that I can explore.

When exploring the sensory garden, I am able to enjoy the different smells and textures of the different plants.
